February 22, 1915 - November 18, 2018

Ardis D. Seeley, 103, of Kalkaska, passed away on November 18, 2018 at Kalkaska Memorial Health Center's Greenhouse where she received excellent care by the dedicated staff. She was born on February 22, 1915 in Kalkaska to the late Clayton and Daisy (Herrington) Eckhardt.

Ardis was a lifelong resident of Kalkaska, raised on her parent's farm on M-66, along with her brother Roy Eckhardt, who preceded her in death. She met and married Clark Seeley, also of Kalkaska, in December of 1935. Together they raised three children. Ardis was known as a homemaker. She enjoyed cooking, sewing, and making her famous caramel corn, popcorn balls, and soft peanut butter cookies. She loved playing cards with her family and friends.

Ardis is survived by her children, Dorena B. (Richard) Raudman of Kalkaska, and Linda L. (Kent) Sieting of Kalkaska; her eight grandchildren, 13 great grandchildren, and 3 great great grandchildren. They were all a great joy in her life and she loved them dearly, as they did her.

She is preceded in death by her beloved husband, Clark W. Seeley and her eldest daughter, Treva E. Bowerman.
