Margery “Marge” Geohegan, 92, passed away at her apartment in Williamsburg on September 17, 2018. She was born Dec. 16, 1925 in Dayton, Ohio to the late C. Lamont and Edith Fisher.

At the University of Miami-Ohio, Marge studied art and later worked as a commercial artist and developed a love for painting. On Sep. 4, 1948 Marge married Kenneth P. Geohegan in Dayton. Together they raised two wonderful sons in Baltimore, Maryland, where Marge participated in scouting and the local civic association. Marge and Ken vacationed each summer at the family cottage in Alden, where they moved to live full-time in 1996. There, Marge enjoyed quilting with the Torch Area Artisans Guild (TAAG).
