Alberta Georgia Zeman, 81, died peacefully on March 8, 2025, surrounded by her loving family after battling dementia for many years.

Camping trips to Canada held a celebratory space for family and friends, cooking up freshly caught walleye and wild blueberry pies with Willie Nelson as the backdrop.

Alberta leaves behind a legacy of love, strength and unwavering kindness. She was a beacon of light and boundless compassion. She will be deeply missed.
