Erma Edna Deater, age 95 of Rapid City, went to be with her Lord and Savior on Saturday, June 29, 2024.

Erma was born on March 19, 1929, to the late Merle and Carrie (Sattler) Barber in Helena Township.

She married Harold A. "Bud" Deater on August 20, 1948. When Bud had his stroke, Erma remained strong in her faith, caring for him until the very end. They were married for 63 years at the time of his passing on January 25, 2011.

Erma was a lifelong member of the Rapid City Church of Christ. She was very active in her community teaching Sunday school and being involved in 4-H. You could always find Erma working in her gardens. She loved flowers and growing/canning fruits and vegetables. She was famous for her dill pickles and salsa. She also took pride in sewing and square dancing with Kalkaska Northern Lights. Erma loved to tell stories about her life and enjoyed sharing the word of God.

We always saw Erma and Bud in the Rapid City Church of Christ until Bud passed. They worked in many ways volunteering in Rapid City.

One memory from our family Henry and Rosemary Udell's. When our brother Tom was born, Bob and David wanted to name him Tom Terrific (a cartoon character on TV), or Bud Deater because he was the Kalkaska County Sheriff in 1960.

Erma taught a lot of us sewing in 4-H. I think we started in the Rapid City School basement. Later I we walked to the Deater's house which was formerly Uncle John and Aunt Dorothy Mariage's home until they moved to Boyne City, MI to run the Boyne City Florist Shop.

Their daughter JoAnne and I shared the same birthday, May 14. JoAnne was born in 1949 and I was born in 1950. We sometimes had birthday parties alternating at the Deater's or the Udell's. I remember sleeping over with JoAnne in the little entrance room of their house, where they had a bunk bed.

Erma taught me everything about sewing. Thanks to her, I had a very pretty 8th grade graduation dress, which was a very complicated dress and fabric for us. But we did it. 😊 She helped me with my prom and graduation dresses. More complicated patterns, fabrics and linings.

Thanks to Erma I made curtains and a bassinet skirt for my son's Nursery, made him some baby clothes, Halloween costumes, and for his 12th birthday "jams" which were popular up to date fabrics in 1987. His friends at his b'day party were very impressed. Also over the years because of Erma, I sewed many birthday and Christmas gifts and other things for the house like duvets, curtains and tablecloths.

Thank you so much to Erma's children for sharing your Mom with us at her home and in the Rapid City Church of Christ as a teacher.
