John was the youngest of ten born to Jose Maria and Maria Galnares in New Braunfels, Texas.

John proudly served his country in the 16th Infantry Regiment of the United States Army. He

went on to obtain a bachelor’s in education from Adrian College with a minor in history. On

June 3rd, 1967, at Saint Mary’s Catholic church in Charlevoix, MI, he married Artis Lee Geer, who survives.

They moved to Traverse City in 1968 when John accepted a teaching position at Traverse City

Senior High School. He taught there for 31 years. John quickly amassed a community of friends

and family. For years he worked as an administrator with the Educational Migrant Program and

was an active member of the local American Legion. He was a devout patron of the Carmelite

Monastery and an avid reader of history. John was a lifelong University of Michigan football

fan. Go Blue! Most of all he enjoyed going on “ventures” with his grandchildren. He is survived by his children Larisa Galnares (Hans VanSumeren) granddaughter Ava VanSumeren; Maria del Pilar Galnares, granddaughters Maria Isabel, Lilah (fiancé Rett Graham) and Adeleine Fiebing; son John P. Galnares (Kelly Carnahan) grandchildren Renzo and Lily Galnares. John is also survived by his sisters Maria Guadalupe Berridge, Simona Rozo Bueno, and many nieces and nephews.
