



## Kenneth Fergusson Bryson

March 1, 1950 - October 2, 2023

Kenneth “Ken” Fergusson Bryson (73 years) passed away peacefully in his home on October 2, 2023. Ken was born in Glasgow, Scotland in 1950. When he was fifteen years old, he immigrated with his adoptive parents to Flushing, Michigan. He graduated from the University of Michigan Flint with a degree in business administration. In the summer of 1972, he took a job at the Boy Scout Camp Tapico in Kalkaska where he fell in love with the natural beauty of northern Michigan and resided his remaining years.

He worked at various places throughout his life. In the late 1970s he began a career in real estate which was his life passion. He earned and maintained his brokerage license by attending annual courses until recently. In his later years, he worked at the local grocery store, Northland, where he was known for his diligence, dependability, and helpful nature.

Ken took great pleasure in helping people who were less fortunate. Often doing the odd job or house project during his free time. He took great pride in living his life fully and actively. Fishing with his grandkids on Log Lake was a treasured pastime, who referred to him as “Grandpa Truck”. His nickname came from his love for collecting and working on automobiles.

Considered to be a dedicated “Kalkaskian” and history enthusiast who spent time volunteering at the Kalkaska County Museum and researching for the Kalkaska Historical Society. He was also an active MENSA member.

Ken is survived by his former wife, Barbara Bryson of Mesa, Arizona; daughters Lorna (Tomas) of Prague, Czech Republic, and Betty (Khoa) of

Gilbert, Arizona; along with grandchildren Sebastian and Stella.
