She married Max Curtis on July 8, 1942 in Vancouver, WA where he was stationed in the Army. Together they moved to Lansing in 1954, where Max owned a Ford Dealership. They were members of the Okemos Community Church and were die hard Spartan fans. Over the years Millie would spend many hours volunteering at hospitals and nursing homes. After her husband's death, she made her home at their cabin, near Kalkaska, on the Manistee River, where she enjoyed the fishing. She loved her family, her dogs, music, sports and the Michigan State Spartans. Millie is survived by her sons, David (Mimi), Eric (Eileen), Danny (Shari) and Tom (Sheila); her grandchildren, Scott (Liz) Curtis, Tiffany (Jamie) Reese, Marc (Mindy) Curtis, Kelli Curtis, Sage Curtis and Kendal Curtis; great-grandchildren, Max, Alex, Mia, Lily, Jack, Emily and Maya; and many nieces, nephews, sister and brother in laws.
